The Connecticut Department of Energy & Environmental Protection (DEEP) is in the final stages of reissuing the **General Permit for the Discharge of Stormwater and Dewatering Wastewaters from Construction Activities** (construction General Permit), to be effective July 1. Even though the current permit doesn't expire until September 30, the first registrations under the new permit may need to be submitted by August 1 (or earlier).

The new General Permit brings significant changes — the registration and compliance process for the new permit is much more comprehensive than the current permit. Some of the important changes include: increased emphasis on impaired waters; new post-construction stormwater standards; LID and runoff reduction measures; rainfall turbidity sampling; new endangered species requirements; third party plan review certification and inspection; and new provisions for public availability and comment.

Most significantly, landscape architects will now have the opportunity to be considered Qualified Professionals for preparing and reviewing construction plans under the new permit.
