**Parking:** The Legislative Office Building (LOB) is directly to the west of the State Capitol in downtown Hartford. (There is a walkway connecting the two buildings.) Because the legislature will be in session that day, the parking garage behind the LOB will probably be filled. There is a parking lot to the west, past the State Armory, and there is also parking on the adjacent streets. Just read the parking signs!

Enter the LOB main entrance on the west side of the building and go up the escalator in the lobby. Go left when you get off the escalator on the second floor and stay to the left above the lobby. Room 2A is on your right immediately before the atrium, which is an open space with a large window directly across from the escalators.
