

3:00-3:30 p.m. Functional and Beautiful: Using Trees for Architectural Effect

Presenter: Darryl Newman, Planters' Choice, LLC

This module will highlight trees that show exceptional resilience, outstanding branch architecture, and lend themselves well to being treated as specimens for outdoor rooms. Trees for both formal and natural designs will be discussed.

3:30-4:00 p.m. Structures in the Landscape

Presenter: John R. Conte, RLA, ASLA, Conte & Conte, LLC

Landscape structures often anchor and set the tone for a landscape design. This presentation will focus on various styles and designs of common (and not so common) structures — such as pet enclosures, decks, and covered terraces — with a slide show including photos, drawings and 3D renderings. The presentation will include a discussion of materials, construction methods, location, zoning restrictions, and drainage considerations for ancillary and accessory structures within the landscape.

Modern tree houses have evolved and grown in backyard popularity. Once just platforms on rickety trees, they have become beautiful structures that utilize modern materials and work with the strengths and growth habit of the trees in which they are built. During this presentation, James will walk you through his approach to designing tree houses, site selection, tree selection, construction methods, and tips for a successful project.

5:45-6:30 p.m. Fire Elements for Outdoor Residential Rooms

Presenter: Brian Cossari, PLA, ASLA, Hoffman Landscapes, Inc.

Over the last decade and a half, homeowners have been investing in outdoor living rooms to expand the features of their homes. This outdoor living movement has required landscape architects and designers to include useful amenities such as fireplaces and fire pits to expand the outdoor season, provide visual stimulus and a social hub for outdoor entertaining and lounging. This module will cover design and safety considerations.

6:30-7:45 p.m. Integrating LED Into Landscape Lighting Design

Presenters: Janet Lennox Moyer and Brooke Silber, Jan & Brooke Luminae, LLC

Janet and Brooke will share how they visualize an outdoor space to create a night environment. They will show day and night comparisons and halogen vs. LED. They will discuss how LED lighting — which varies significantly from other familiar light sources — has propelled landscape lighting forward, providing more flexibility to create a successful solution. Complications surrounding LED lighting technology will also be covered. Finally, the presenters will discuss the importance of planning and flexibility from the inception of a lighting project in order to be able to respond to all the changes that a landscape will experience.
