(Genesis 3: CONSTRUCTION 308 / 0.2 IACET CEUs) – Presenter:

This module will explore methods for creating the tremendous visual and functional applications of water-in-transit, such as vanishing edges, deck-level slot overflows, and elevated perimeter overflows. Topics will include flow rate requirements, different edge details for creating various effects, and establishing line-of-sight goals and project objectives. Also included: hydraulic system design, catch basins, surge tanks, proper slopes, and air venting of gravity flow systems to enable efficient flow rates while minimizing noise.

1:30-3:00 The Natural Pool Alternative — Plants Instead of Chemicals (Genesis 3: ENGINEERING 121 / 0.2 IACET CEUs) – Presenter: James Robyn, BioNova

Natural Swimming Pools (NSPs) are 100% chemical-free constructed wetland ecosystems in which all clarification and purification of the water is achieved with biological filtration. Developed in Europe over 25 years ago, NSPs are just now starting to gain foothold in the U.S. This program introduces the five different types of residential NSPs. The science of biological filtration and microbiological standards will be discussed to demonstrate how NSPs ensure the health and safety of swimmers.

Designers will learn how difficult site conditions can be addressed with specialized earth work and other construction processes to yield spectacular results (in these examples, a cliff side vanishing edge pool, and a perimeter slot overflow pool).
