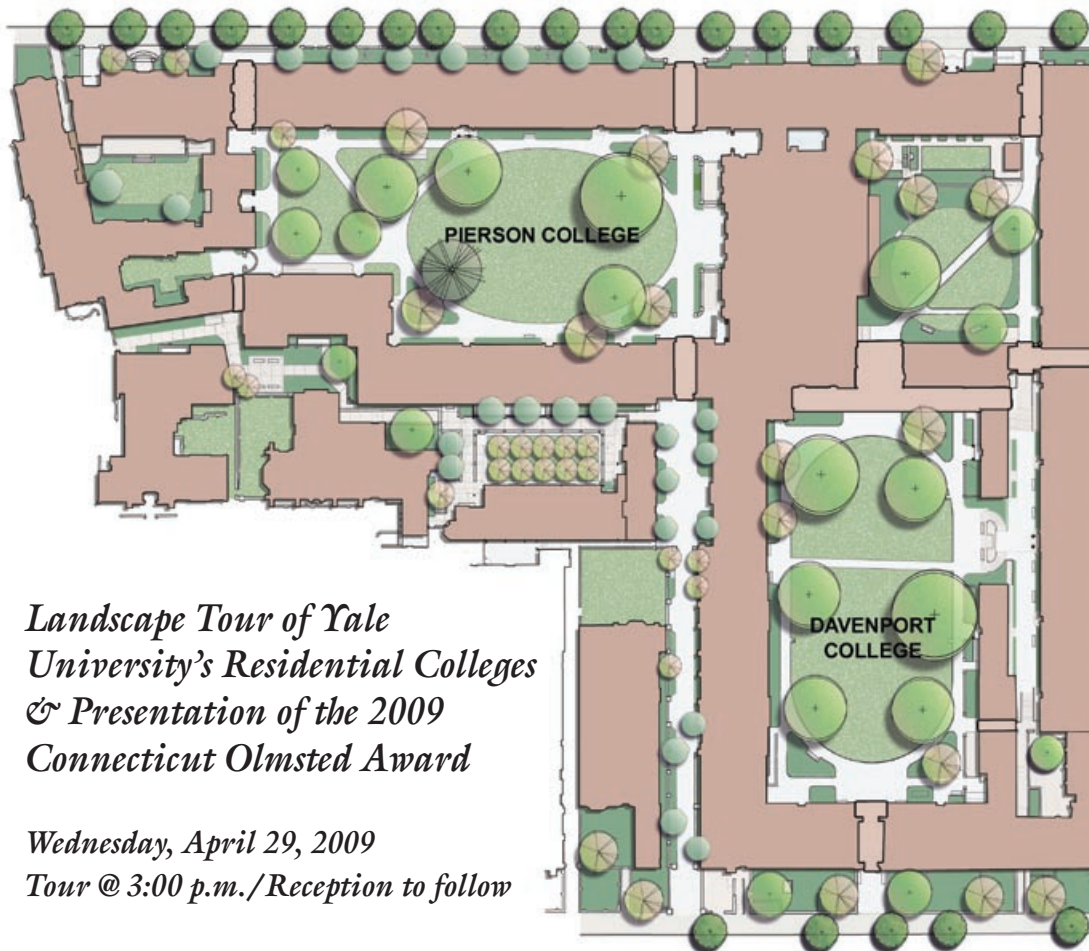

# Celebrate Olmsted's Heritage and National Landscape Architecture Month

## Landscape Tour of Yale University's Residential Colleges, Pierson and Davenport (conducted by Channing Harris, ASLA, of Towers|Golde)

- ▶ Courtyards originally designed by ASLA founder Beatrix Jones Farrand in the early 1930s
- ▶ Site renovations by Towers|Golde with nearly all new plantings, historic paving, masonry fabrication, site furnishings and lighting (winner of awards by CTASLA, Connecticut Trust for Historic Preservation and the Society for College and University Planning/American Institute of Architects)
- ▶ Technical discussion of major tree preservation, drainage, barrier-free access (over 20 barriers removed in two Colleges), lighting and security, and special events planning

Our 2009 Connecticut Olmsted Award recipient, **James Gustave Speth**, is Dean of the Yale School of Forestry and Environmental Studies, a professor, scientist, author, lawyer and environmentalist. Gus has worked for the United Nations Development Program, was founder and president of the World Resources Institute, professor of law at Georgetown University, chairman of the U.S. Council on Environmental Quality and was a co-founder of the Natural Resources Defense Council. He has worked with Connecticut agencies and NGO's on environmental and energy issues in the state, and is a leader in the struggle against global warming, as evidenced by his latest book, *The Bridge at the Edge of the World: Capitalism, the Environment, and Crossing from Crisis to Sustainability*. Locally, Dean Speth has assisted Mayor DeStefano on several environmental projects.



We'll convene at **Davenport College entrance**, 248 York Street, New Haven, at 3:00 p.m. Our reception will be in the newly renovated **Yale Visitor Center** (149 Elm Street) on New Haven's historic Green, recognized in 1999 (on ASLA's 100th anniversary) as one of the Society's "Centennial Medallion Sites." The Green is the center of New Haven's original "Nine Squares," laid out in 1638. Frederick Law Olmsted's 187th Birthday will also be recognized!

Parking is suggested at 150 York Street garage, 65 Grove Street garage, or the Broadway or Elm Street parking lots.

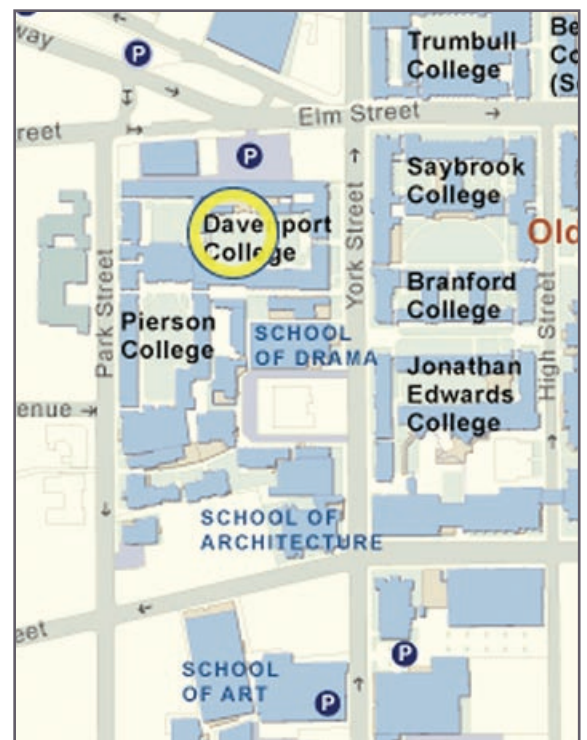
