Connecticut Chapter of the American Society of Landscape Architects Announces 2005 Scholarship Recipients

New Haven, Connecticut, November 1, 2005 — The Connecticut Chapter of the American Society of Landscape Architects (CTASLA) has announced that **Kevin Joseph Gaughan**, of Vernon, CT and **Claire Fellman** of West Hartford have been named 2005 CTASLA Student Scholarship award recipients. These \$2,500 scholarships, funded in part from proceeds from the Chapter's annual Golf Outing, are awarded to encourage awareness and education in the field of landscape architecture.

"CTASLA is proud to give these scholarships on behalf of our members and sponsors," said Jim Tate, a past president of the Chapter who is an active organizer of the Golf Outing.

Gaughan, who is majoring in Landscape Architecture at the University of Maryland, has dedicated a great deal of energy to the improvement of the program and the promotion of the field. He is an organizer of LaBash 2006, a national student-run conference to celebrate landscape architecture. This summer, he took part in a 10-week course of study in Costa Rica focusing on sustainable community design.

Fellman, who graduated magna cum laude from Carleton College in 1997, is a Master in Landscape Architecture candidate at the University of Pennsylvania. Of her chosen profession she writes: "I believe that landscape architects can occupy the space between cultural and aesthetic questions, scientific inquiry, and engineered interventions. I hope to do work that shifts the boundaries between these fields and refigures our relationship with our surroundings."
