

2025 Landscape Architecture Environmental Stewardship Scholarship for High School Seniors

Connecticut Chapter, American Society of Landscape Architects (CTASLA)

PURPOSE: CTASLA awards scholarships to college-bound high school seniors based on: academic achievement, financial need, and an expressed interest in pursuing an education leading to a career in Landscape Architecture.

> Landscape architects analyze, plan, design, manage, and nurture the built and natural environments. Landscape architects have a significant impact on communities and quality of life. They design parks, campuses, streetscapes, trails, plazas, and other projects that help define a community.

- CRITERIA: Eligible students must be graduating high school seniors residing in Connecticut who intend to continue their education majoring in landscape architecture at an accredited four-year college or university. Considerations will be given to academic achievement, financial need, and the student's intent to study landscape architecture.
- GUIDELINES: The CTASLA Scholarship is awarded annually in the spring of the high school senior year. Students must continue to attend classes and maintain no lower than a 3.0 grade-point average (or equivalent).
- AMOUNT: The scholarship awarded will be up to \$2,500 which will be disbursed as a one-time payment, in August, directly to the student's accepted university. At the discretion of the Scholarship Committee, more than one award may be disbursed based on the number of qualified applicants.
- REQUIREMENTS: 1) Complete the application form (also found on the CTASLA website at www.ctasla.org/scholarship).

2) Provide your full high school transcript covering your past semesters up to the semester of submission.

3) Provide a brief statement that clearly states why you desire this financial aid, what interests you, and why you have chosen to study Landscape Architecture. Include an example of a past experience and/or a community service that shows an interest in this field of study. This statement must be signed by the applicant.

4) Provide one signed recommendation letter from a person who knows you personally and can explain why you are interested in this course of study.

Applications must be received no later than **5 PM on April 18th**, **2025**. The winner will be announced by **May 9th**, **2025**. Becoming a Landscape Architect

Landscape architects plan and design traditional places such as parks, residential developments, campuses, gardens, cemeteries, commercial centers, resorts, transportation corridors, corporate and institutional centers and waterfront developments.

Meeting human needs by making wise use of our environmental resources is work that is in demand today and will continue to be needed in the future.
